A Note From YOUR VICAR

Last week I completed my first ever 'Escape Room'. It was enormous fun. Four of us tried to escape the 'Volcano Temple of Doom' (or something) in the lovely building opposite Silver Street Baptist Church. This is a relatively new business with an enthusiastic and friendly guy who is simultaneously a dungeon master guide, chief cook and bottle washer who is hoping the place takes off further; at one point I actually turned to the cameras and apologised for making a mess (which was part of the game) for as someone who has to regularly setup and setdown plans, I felt an empathy for him.

The rooms follow a sort of Indiana Jonesy type vibe and are all charmingly done in a manner reminiscent of the Crystal Maze from the 90s. Our team was made up of me, my longstanding friend and two of my children. Confronted with a challenge each of us took completely different approaches. Some stood looking at the problem and trying to figure it out in their head, others tried to touch, shake and jiggle everything that seemed like it would move. Initially, the 'sit back and observe' camp was a bit rubbish. The game needed effort; you had to try different things before you could do anything at all productive and whilst in a real Indiana Jones temple we would have been eaten by spiders/spiked to death/melted in lava by acting with such haste, in the building opposite Silver Street death equals too much paperwork and so we were fine. The truth was that we needed all of the different bits of the team. The pioneering go-getters were fine until they were so close they couldn't see the problem, the ones who

stood aloof from the group tended to see things that nobody else could see, and the have-a-go-heroes made the final puzzles get finished.

But this is all gloss that has come from our respectable finish time (47 minutes – mean time – 71...thank you). In the actual moment our differences weren't celebrated; they were kind of annoying. The noisier ones thought the quieter ones were being boring and the quieter ones could not hear themselves think. Ill let you decide who was who.

Our discomfort was actually profoundly productive; our differences made us more effective. In the New Testament St Paul writes that 'you are the body of Christ but you're not all the same...the hand is not the foot...and it's only when each part, plays it's own part (not pretending to be another) that something beautiful is produced. We live in a time where divisions are made to sell us political parties and more consumer products; churches can fall into silos where basically everyone looks and sounds the same. This can feel more comfortable but misses the trick. The church was always kind of annoying to itself; Jews and Gentiles grumbling; women and men arguing; slaves and masters worshipping together. In other words if your church is kind of annoying; that's a good thing. It means there is difference which can go forward; it's when it's monochrome, predictable and 'comfortable' (ugh) that we don't spur each other on to seek God and serve the community. God bless.

You could really sense the Holy Spirit at work so your prayers really were much appreciated by us all. 

"We are a national charity working to transform the hopes and happiness of young people facing abuse, exploitation and neglect. We support them through their most serious life challenges and we campaign tirelessly for the big social changes that will improve the lives of those who need hope most. We've been doing this for 140 years and we won't stop until we've built a society where hope is alive in every child.

We walk towards the young people that society crosses the road to avoid. We see something in these children, that something is:

Hope

Hope for a happier home life, hope of getting a job, of getting away from the people who exploit and hurt them.

Hope of overcoming the obstacles modern life puts in front of them and hope that tomorrow can be better than today.

It's right there in the centre of every young person in Britain. Even those who have it toughest of all, those who are exploited, neglected, unsafe.

We see it.

And we fight for it.

Sometimes hope takes a battering. Sometimes it's hidden by doubt, aggression or mistrust. Sometimes it's hanging by a thread. But we know it's there.

And that's why we do everything in our power to restore it, protect it and strengthen it.

We're building hope in the young people

who need it most, through campaigning and support.

And we won't rest until we've created a society built for all children.

Where hope is alive in every child.

Because no young person should be left without it.

We fight for hope by deeply understanding the needs of young people and by supporting them through their most serious life challenges. We work with young people who have suffered years of abuse, who have run away from home or are struggling with mental health issues. We look out for young carers and those who are at risk of being groomed by criminal groups. We help refugees who have no one else to turn to in this country.

The young people we meet have complicated lives. Their experiences are always different, but young people all have one thing in common. It's a thing called hope.

Hope for a happier home life. Hope of getting a job, of getting away from the people who exploit or hurt them. So we find their hope and start there, working with them little by little, giving them whatever they need and empowering them to make decisions for the future they want.

We work with young people for as long as it takes and across all different aspects of their life as it's rarely simple for them. There might be aggression, mistrust, anger or disappointment, but even when hope is hanging by a thread we help them find it again.


