A Note From **YOUR VICAR**

When I was a kid I really loved wrestling. I mean the brash, loud and big American Wrestling. WWE it's now called (it will always be WWF in my heart!). I loved it. I had a lot of action figures, a ring they could fight in with sounds (1,2....3!) I collected the sticker sets and in a completely unique childhood experience my Dad even took me to Wembley to watch Summerslam 1992. The old Wembley was filled with adoring fans and wrestlers with outlandish names and outfits. The Legion of Doom actually rode their motorbikes into the stadium; the Ultimate Warrior ran around a lot and the Undertaker seemed to balance on the top rope for a very long time for reasons I can barely discern. The saddest thing was that my obsession was largely out of reach as it was all on Sky TV. Probably made me more interested!

Like most childhood fascinations I grew out of it. Part of this was the realisation that Wrestling is fake. Everyone who hates WWE likes to tell you this is true...but it can only be so true. A human being somersaulting 8ft over a rope and hitting another human being...still happens and will still hurt them both...it's kind of like stunt men. So when someone says 'fake' they don't mean 'nothing is happening but what they actually mean is 'they aren't really fighting; the result is preplanned and the moves are rehearsed'. So now it's called 'Wrestling entertainment'. A lot of people think of Christianity a bit like wrestling. Obviously there are fewer fireworks, I thankfully don't jump around in my underwear - and although some clerical outfits are outlandish (google the 'cappa

mantle') it's not quite as dramatic as the WWE. What I mean is that some people think we do something in church but it's kind of faking it, like a big game.

But it's not fake. It's real. Really real. We've just had Christmas which is a celebration of God coming to our real world in Jesus. And amid all the fripperies of Christmas it's worth remembering that it's our real world Jesus came to, where he really did walk the shores of galilee, really did teach and annoy, really did eat and drink, bleed and die, really did come back anew again. Those 12 men that followed him did not make money or get famous from telling their stories. The writers of the bible were not paid by wealthy publishers. They believed it was true because they saw the stuff happen with their actual eyes. They mostly died telling those stories. You don't tend to die for a story you've made up.

Here at St Georges, we're not playing at this faith thing. We believe it's true. Really true and that by accepting that truth, your whole life can be changed. So what about you? What do you believe? Have you ever asked yourself? Is this life really just about working hard to get a good education; get a job; have a kid and then a race to buy the biggest house/car/boat/whatever else? Away Day to discuss governance and vision for St George's moving forward as our last one was back in 2022.



The Besom in Taunton was formed in 2005 by Nesta Long. Nesta remained the leader of the organisation until her death in 2016.

Nesta was struck by the number of needy people in the Taunton area and as a Christian felt challenged to put her faith into action by making a positive impact on their lives.

"The Besom in Taunton is a Christian organisation that provides a bridge between those who want to give and those who are in need in the Taunton and Wellington area.

Giving is at the heart of all we do. Everything we provide is free of charge to clients referred to Besom. We receive donations from individuals and a wide range of organisations - furniture, kitchen equipment, bedlinen, money and more. What goes out is quickly replaced by more donations, as our prayers are answered - very often just what is needed for that moment."

Besom provides practical help enabling recipients to improve their home and garden when they could not achieve this by themselves They will decorate one or two rooms or the hall, stairs and landing in a house or flat for a recipient who is unable to do this themselves. Besom time-givers are able to clear or tidy gardens that have been unmanaged for a period of time. Garden waste such as grass clippings, brambles etc are removed and disposed of by the project team. One of the major requirements is for furniture and household items for those who lack what is needed to make a home.

FOUNDATION GOVERNOR VACANCY

St George's Church led the foundation of Bishop Henderson Church of England Voluntary Aided Primary School in Galmington in 1974. This is now very popular and successful, with 14 classes and over 420 pupils.

St George's has maintained strong links with the School by supplying a long line of Foundation Governors, and also through Rev. Jenny Jeffery's role of School Chaplain.

The School is proud of its distinctive Christian status as a CEVA school within the Diocese of Bath ad Wells.

The School's Board of Governors, which normally meets 6 times a year, now has a vacancy for a Foundation Governor, to be nominated by St George's Church. It would be wonderful if a member of our congregation (possibly a parent of children already at, or soon to be at the School) felt called to fill this role, further strengthening the School's core value: "the Christian belief in a loving God who values each individual".

The key responsibility of each of the six Foundation Governors is to preserve and develop the Christian character of the School. However, the role of any Governor is essentially strategic - to work with the Headteacher to:

- Help to develop a clear vision, ethos and strategic direction for the School
- Hold the Headteacher and other leaders to account for their performance in ensuring that every pupil has the best possible education
- Oversee the financial performance of the School and ensure its money is well spent
- Ensure that the views of parents, staff and community representatives are heard and taken into account
- Ensure that the School complies with its legal and statutory obligations.

Whilst you might offer your experience, skills and knowledge, the new experience and skills you would gain will undoubtedly be of long-term personal benefit.
