community, of being there for each other in our darkest hours. Putting aside differences and past hurts to come together. As Christians we find solace in the promise of eternal life and the hope that comes from our faith.

And right on the heels of these significant events, we have a wedding! A celebration of love and commitment uniting two lives. Weddings are reminders of God's love and the covenant He establishes, not just in our individual lives but within our church family. It was the perfect contrast to the week's earlier event—a celebration of new beginnings, hope, and the promise of forever. Congratulations Natasha and Charles!

Amidst all this, let's not forget that we also had Halloween. While the world might focus on spooky ghosts and ghouls, we as a church choose to seek the light. We have the incredible opportunity to shine brightly in a time that often dwells on darkness. We need to be beacons of hope and joy! Instead of haunted houses, we need to celebrate the goodness of God.

So as we come to the end of one week and begin this next one, I'm sure it will again be filled with highs and lows, but together, we can navigate these moments with love, support, and grace. Let's continue to uplift one another, celebrating the joys and comforting each other in sorrow, all while seeking the light in every situation as we said those words at the Baptisms

Bishop's letter – 'It takes the whole world to know Christ'

Do you think a fish knows that it's swimming in water? I've been reflecting on this question not because it's some kind of Buddhist koan - the type of question that asks, 'What's the sound of one hand clapping?' Rather it's because I've been reflecting recently on questions of culture and world view. Do I see the world purely from the perspective of being who I am? (A 55-year-old white Englishman who grew up in a small village in the 1970s.) If that's the case, is what I see an accurate representation of the whole of reality? Might other perspectives be possible? If I could see the world through the eyes of others, might my vision be richer, wider, deeper? Like a fish that suddenly realizes that seeing can happen not only through water, but through air as well?

Seeing things from the perspective of others was something that Jesus did. An example of this happens when Jesus heals a centurion's servant in Luke's Gospel (Luke 7: 1-10). The centurion comes from a background and culture that's entirely different to that in which Jesus grew up. Yet Jesus is blown away by the insight that the centurion has about who Jesus himself is. This leads Jesus to exclaim 'I tell you, not even in Israel have I found such faith!'

The Diocese of Bath and Wells has a link with the five Anglican Dioceses of Zambia. There's much to be celebrated in the friendship that we share: the joy and vitality of the Zambian Church, the opportunities our link offers to help some of the world's poorest communities. But for me, the greatest gift we gain is the opportunity our link offers to stand in the shoes of others and to see the world, our faith, and the whole of reality from a different perspective.

A wise person once said to me 'It takes the whole world to know Christ'. Our link with Zambia enables us to see more of the Jesus we share than we could ever hope to experience otherwise.




