A Note From **YOUR VICAR**

Last Friday I had an extraordinary meeting. My guitar needed something called a 'setup' which is a bit like a 'service' for a car. I'm not quite sure what they do but I know it's better after it. I've never had one of these before and so was quite unsure of how to proceed. Our curly-curate gave me a number of a 'guy' and so I took the plunge. Turns out he is not just a 'guy' but a proper 'luthier'.

It all went a bit wrong, at least to begin with. Firstly I happened to call him in the middle of a prayer meeting. Prayer is such an intimate thing that this mistake felt like I accidentally walked in on someone changing clothes. He hung up on me. That was weird, I said to Mrs Griffin. Texting out an apology he called back. 'Come over! I can do it this afternoon'.

Secondly, I got lost trying to find the house. When I called again, I was literally opposite with the house sign covered over by the recycling. It was not an auspicious start. 'Come in!' Mr. Luthier welcomed me! I've got a song for you. He played me a folk version of the prayer of 'thanksgiving' at the end of the communion service 'Almighty God, unto whom all hearts are open...'beautiful. I kept asking him questions about his life, mutual acquantainces (does simply everyone know and love Chris Sampson – I wonder how far we can travel to find someone who disagrees!) and music. We stayed chatting for about an hour and a half.

He told me of playing music in bars and concerts; the way that half-drunk and semihigh people would hear the old gospel words to a new instrumentation and somehow create a 'moment' of peace and harmony in the middle of a rowdy bar. The word 'rapture' is the right one; 'caught up' in a moment that only somehow musicians can open up, when there is a sense of flow, unity and harmony between people. These little moments last only shards of time and the recollection of them is both beautiful and painful at their absence. In total he played me 4 songs. I loved it.

This Christmas will be full of singing and there will be moments; instances which are opened up by notes and chords blended together to give a sense of unity and harmony amongst a group of almost strangers. Music somehow opens up little windows of reality into seeing some deeper reality of grace, of truth, of God in a way that almost nothing else can. When I pray about this busy season, I pray that the Holy Spirit will make a way, so that those who are hurried and harried by this fast paced and noisy world will enjoy those moments of grace so much that they want more of that peace of the Christ child in their wider life. This Christmas don't let the words wash over you, find a way to extend the moments of harmony beyond the initial to shaping it into a whole life lived consciously before a God who loves you.

Oh and the guitar is fixed and beautiful. God Bless



"We are a national charity working to transform the hopes and happiness of young people facing abuse, exploitation and neglect. We support them through their most serious life challenges and we campaign tirelessly for the big social changes that will improve the lives of those who need hope most. We've been doing this for 140 years and we won't stop until we've built a society where hope is alive in every child.

We walk towards the young people that society crosses the road to avoid. We see something in these children, that something is:

Hope

Hope for a happier home life, hope of getting a job, of getting away from the people who exploit and hurt them.

Hope of overcoming the obstacles modern life puts in front of them and hope that tomorrow can be better than today.

It's right there in the centre of every young person in Britain. Even those who have it toughest of all, those who are exploited, neglected, unsafe.

We see it.

And we fight for it.

Sometimes hope takes a battering. Sometimes it's hidden by doubt, aggression or mistrust. Sometimes it's hanging by a thread. But we know it's there.

And that's why we do everything in our power to restore it, protect it and strengthen it.

We're building hope in the young people

who need it most, through campaigning and support.

And we won't rest until we've created a society built for all children.

Where hope is alive in every child.

Because no young person should be left without it.

We fight for hope by deeply understanding the needs of young people and by supporting them through their most serious life challenges. We work with young people who have suffered years of abuse, who have run away from home or are struggling with mental health issues. We look out for young carers and those who are at risk of being groomed by criminal groups. We help refugees who have no one else to turn to in this country.

The young people we meet have complicated lives. Their experiences are always different, but young people all have one thing in common. It's a thing called hope.

Hope for a happier home life. Hope of getting a job, of getting away from the people who exploit or hurt them. So we find their hope and start there, working with them little by little, giving them whatever they need and empowering them to make decisions for the future they want.

We work with young people for as long as it takes and across all different aspects of their life as it's rarely simple for them. There might be aggression, mistrust, anger or disappointment, but even when hope is hanging by a thread we help them find it again.
