A Note From YOUR VICAR

I write on the cusp of the election. The noise has been building for weeks and filling my social media and news feeds with nonsense on a daily basis as each side tries to use each mistake as a sign that the other is doomed. Both sides Republican and Democrat demonise one another as both predict a total meltdown of society if the other wins. Democrats picture a Handmaiden style fascist theocracy and Republicans warn of economic doomsday brought on by illegal immigrants. I don't really remember western public dialogue falling to such poor standards.

'Security experts' warn that whatever the result the threat of violence in the US is very high and it's worth just remembering how bizarre all this drama is. The levels of public violence in speech and action is very high and somehow normalised and after such a long period of extended peace in the West, we can be lulled into thinking that peace will just persist forever. But the history of human beings indicates that peace is the exception not the rule of history, the peace we now enjoy is a delicate fabric which can easily be torn. Human society is fragile. When it breaks, the situation left is not always better and not all change is good.

This week is Remembrance Sunday. Most of the generation that fought in those great and awful wars have now died, so what does remembrance now mean? Two things are clear to me; first we honour those who've gone before even if they don't know about it and secondly because the act of remembering shapes the mind of the generations that flow through time afterwards. It tells us that life is precious but it is fragile; that in order to say yes to things like freedom we have to say no to bullies; that bullies don't really listen to words and so sometimes you have to show 'no' as well as say 'no'. It's a bit like staying still. When you're dashing about it sounds like the easiest thing in the world but to really stay still, to actually not move, takes a lot of work; restraint and self control. To make peace you have to work at it. The passage we'll use in the scout service this week will be Psalm 46.

Remembrance Sunday

Be still and know that I am

It's a passage that is often used at retreat centres but actually it's not a retreat but follows the end of a long section where conflict has been rife and the world falling apart.

That 'being still' and not freaking out like the rest of the world is hard work Remembrance invites us to be still together for just 2 minutes and in the stillness, my prayer is that we find truth, that we even find God.




