#### A Note From **YOUR VICAR**

My knee hurts for no obvious reason; my palms are bruised and there is a peculiar ache in the arch of my foot. It's not just because time never really stops.

I went climbing.

Not proper climbing you understand with little stakes and a hammer in the side of a mountain but indoor climbing in an arena that's designed to be family friendly. So there is less chalk and more multicoloured handholds with time buzzers for people to race up walls. I went with the family which inevitably meant I competed with my kids. Which probably explains my knee and hand and feet pain. On one wall, I got to compete with two of them at the same time. A race. I am bigger and stronger, so I took the harder route. 3,2,1 Go.

I was thrashed. I made it to the top of this constructed huge plastic sphere edifice thing but I was trounced by people smaller and weaker than me. How? Well because I tried to climb using my superior strength and reach - leaping for handholds and then pulling up. But I am not a gorilla and this approach has it's severe limitations. They beat me because they used their arms and legs to use the different handholds whereas I was trying to dash through using my size. They used their brains; I did not! When I watched them a second time through and realised where I'd gone wrong and sped up the process....I'll get them next time!

What does winning look like? In the gospels, two men and then later their Mum (!) approach Jesus and ask to sit on his left and right. In other words, can we be the Elon to your Trump; the power beside the throne. This really really annoyed the other disciples. But probably because they hadn't thought of it first. You don't know what you ask says Jesus. And they didn't know at all. The two brothers, James and John played a big part in the growth of the early church; James was the first church martyr whereas John wrote large parts of the New Testament and died a martyr's death in exile. Both wanted to 'win' but like me on the wall they didn't really understand the game they were playing. Sometimes people ask me whether the early church all got rich from writing the bible and the answer to that question is yes and no. Yes they did get rich but not in money. The aim for the Christian is just not the same as the rest of the world around us. We ain't playing the same game and so our tools for the task aren't the same.

Blessed are the meek says Jesus. Blessed are the Poor and the gentle and the peacemakers and merciful and more. Christians 'win' when we love God and love our neighbour. Then these strange sounding phrases - blessed are you - make more sense because they give us the tools not to beat others, but to love them.

### ST GEORGE'S CHARITY COLLECTION


For the month of February we will be supporting our Bursary Fund so that we can support any of our Church Family who needs a helping hand.


