A Note From YOUR VICAR

I've just bought a terrarium....

I didn't know what they were until recently either...it's a glass bottle filled with soil, a few suitable plants and enough water. At the top is a cork stopper. It is a complete eco-system. There is enough water in there for the plants to survive and breathe, evaporation forces the water to condensate on the side of the glass, when it cools down it will slide to the bottom and rewater the plants. It's complete and possibly – I say possibly because I've only had it a week – a house plant that I will not kill.

If I'm honest, I don't even especially care for the plants – they're some kind of Fittonia (?) and some mossy looking things – by which I mean I just think this idea is plain cool.

The plants will grow and grow as long as I don't open the stopper, don't knock over the bottle (more likely) and occasionally rotate it so that sunlight can get to different bits. I saw one example online which hadn't been opened for 61 years. It's a closed ecosystem because it's a complete ecosystem and it was only 15 quid at Lidl.

Our Church is a charity which means that our aim is basically redistributive of public goods rather than giving profits to private individuals or shareholders like a business. In other words, we are constantly giving stuff away, whether that's time, energy or sometimes money too. If we 'make more money' I don't get paid more, we give more away. When we run projects that are branches of the main church, one of my aims is that they become self-sustaining, a new little 'terrarium' where they can develop their own funding, volunteers and aims. I like projects that 'wash their own faces' so they make enough money to keep themselves going without the wider church having to support them financially and not needing too much prodding from me, so I can get on and start other new projects (CAP Money course coming September...). A good example is the 'community fridge' or 'Soup' (hopefully returning October-ish). People often say that the Church of England has loads of money. It does. But it's locked up in legal vaults that even Archbishops can barely access without an act of Parliament and certainly doesn't trickle down to parish churches like ours very often! We run entirely on donations, rent from the hall and the odd grant I can rustle from behind a sofa.

When thinking about this article, I nearly extended the metaphor of a terrarium to the whole church. But all metaphors have limits and this one is too big to work. The ridiculous generous thing about the Church of England is that it is open to you. Really open. It's not a closed society but an open one. There are no secrets – our meetings are public and we want you to come. There is no cork in this bottle and we don't want to keep things to ourselves, we want to share the good news and blessing of God with you too.
