A Note From YOUR VICAR

This week has been full of drama. An 82 year old man has been accused of cheating, lying and fraud at the International Conkers tournament. Mr David Jakin has been attempting to win the 'greatest show on earth' (said no one) for 42 years and this year managed it. His competitors said that he 'destroyed' their conkers with a single hit....which apparently does not happen very often. Jakin was involved in drilling and stringing up to 240 different conkers made for the competition but this time the judge won.

After receiving the 'conker crown' (I made that bit up but if there isn't one then jolly well should be), fellow contestants insisted that Mr Jakin was searched and inside his pocket was discovered a home-made steel conker painted to a great replica with a string already attached. Apparently this was intended as a joke...(which he never told) and he insists that he did not use the offending item in the competition and won simply by using the strength and power of his manly arms (I may have added a bit of flourish there).

I haven't worked in prisons but my understanding is that most residents claim they are innocent; it's something humans often do when we've done something wrong, we find ways to justify ourselves. It's why a 'guilty plea' will get a reduced sentence in law – even though the action hasn't actually changed. In lower level things people often say 'it's a joke' when they are afraid of the consequences of their actions or words.

I have a confession for you. I made a fake conker once at my friend Josh's house. It was made of baked Fimo and I dreamt of being the playground king of Bishop Henderson School. But I never used it. I couldn't bear the idea of somehow everyone finding out and then not really being the conker king but a fraud. I grew out of this dream aged 9 so it is a little sad that Mr Jakin still harbours these dreams at 82.

These seem like frivolous ideas but at root the question is about integrity. Did we really do something or fake it? Did we really mean what we said or pretend to? It's the perennial question of politics and will come into sharp focus with the US elections next month when President Trump is already claiming fraud on the other side. This feels more complex in a digital age but its only the tools that have become more sophisticated; the human heart still weaves tangled webs. The bible has much to say; 'The LORD detests dishonest scales, but accurate weights find favour with him' says Proverbs 11 and although this may refer to trading grains the principle transfers to modern business practice very easily. Or even simpler, Jesus call for integrity, 'let your yes, be yes and your no, no'.

I've wanted to put on a conkers competition here since I started....maybe it's more dramatic than I can manage.

CONFIRMATION TIME...

On the **20th November at 7.30pm** we will have a confirmation service in St Georges Wilton. But what is this thing and why would you want to bother?

Confirmation is a rite of passage that affirms your place within the body of the whole Anglican church rather than just a local congregation. Only a Bishop can confirm someone, as they represent the church more widely than just a single and local church. In the Church of England 'belonging' is a funny thing; everyone who lives nearby has a right to be baptised, married and buried here because we believe that the gospel is too good to be kept for ourselves and everyone is welcome. But when you're baptised in one church - you're baptised in ALL of the churches because there is only one church. You can only be confirmed once and in confirmation, you take those words that perhaps were spoken on your behalf as an infant - 'I believe' and make them your own in a public and deliberate way that describes something of your journey as a Christian.

Within the Anglican church, confirmation has historically been the entrance to receiving communion (although because we work across the churches, this is not strictly observed), a requirement before you can hold many 'offices' of responsibility, and before you can be ordained or licensed as a lay minister. St Georges has grown marvellously in the past few years and many have come back to faith or a new faith. Perhaps this is a way of saying to God and to your friends and family, I take my faith seriously and this is my home.

What will happen?

Before the service we will meet as a little group to prepare. Then on the day there will be a service with the Bishop and he will pray for you to receive the Holy Spirit by laying his hands on your head. Afterwards you get a certificate which is like your right to engage in some of those responsibilities I listed above.

What now?

I already have 3 candidates but something inside tells me that there are some more amongst our number! If you want to be

TAUNTON TEAM CHAPLAINCY

The aim of the Chaplaincy is to serve Taunton's workforce and the community in general by offering a friendly, listening ear, and impartial and confidential support through the ups and downs of life.

Chaplains are drawn from local churches and linked with a workplace or area to visit (usually) weekly with the purpose of offering friendly and supportive care to all. A chaplain's main aim is to listen and take an interest in the people they meet and provide comfort and compassion as appropriate.

Over a period a chaplain will get to know and to be known and accepted as a caring friend.

While the Chaplaincy is unashamedly Christian there is no intention to 'preach' and support is offered to all, those of any faith or none. Anyone can turn to their chaplain for support and, whilst chaplains are impartial and non-judgmental, caring for people rather than counselling them, they are able to signpost to organisations that can offer focused help. All conversations are treated as confidential within the Chaplaincy (subject to UK laws and safeguarding good practice).

As well as retail stores and offices, TTC also run Rail Responders at our Taunton Railway Station and visit Care Homes as well as now being at Taunton Magistrates Courts where they offer support to anyone who is involved in the activities of the day including staff, witnesses, victims, defendants, and their friends and family members.


