A Note From YOUR VICAR

'Sticks and stones can break my bones but words can never hurt me.' So that was a lie.

This little rhyme was never true and indeed the very fact that it exists undermines it's central message, for if words really didn't have any impact then we wouldn't have to chant this to our children. The last week has seen extraordinary scenes on our streets with cars set alight, riots and many police officers hurt or injured. The terrible murders of those girls in Southport - so young - so tragic - so meaningless and has inspired more violence, more aggression and seemingly more meaninglessness. You know the story by now. The man who killed those girls was initially reported to be Islamic but which was quickly corrected when it emerged he wasn't religious and had grown up in Wales as a quiet introverted lad. Somehow this became a rallying touchpoint for these terrible riots. Some were clearly driven by a particular ideology; some were clearly along for the adrenaline ride and those looting 'Crocs' from Sports Direct are hardly landing blows for immigration policy.

It is also so strange how sometimes words 'catch on' and other times they fade into insignificance. Smokers regularly toss out their glowing cigarette ends onto the floor and it's mostly messy and inconsiderate but not life damaging; but sometimes it causes raging fires. Most of the time stupid comments online remain stupid comments and sometimes they swirl things into actions. Emojis those little cartoons – once patronised as something only children use – are now getting people imprisoned for incitement of violence.

St James writes:

'The tongue is a small part of the body but it makes great boasts. Consider what a great forest is set on fire by a small spark. The tone also is a fire, a world of evil among the parts of the body and corrupts the whole person...'

If you haven't read it, the letter of James doesn't mince his words because he knows words are powerful and have to be used carefully. Not all of those who posted on facebook, twitter or whatever other social media thing necessarily felt like their words would have effect but somehow it did and now they pay the consequences. In a small town like Taunton it can feel like we're small players on the world stage – that we are – yet still our words matter and we do not know which of them will fall to light a spark. Your words matter.

How we use them is the second question and there the bible gives different advice. Silence is a good course much of the time, if you don't know what to say, then shutting up is better than speaking until you land on an opinion. And yet the bible is clear that people must speak out against injustice. We remember how those deeds of that 'Good Samaritan' were not directed to those who looked, spoke and even believed the same things.
